

Experienced teachers, workshop leaders and performers based in North Lincolnshire. They're both involved in running Folklincs, the North Lincolnshire Youth Folk Ensemble and currently devising a folk school for the North Lincolnshire area. Most importantly for Whitby,

they are the longstanding leaders of the Infamous Festival Orchestra!

TAFFY THOMAS

Taffy founded and directed the legendary folk theatre company, Magic Lantern, illustrating traditional stories and songs with shadow puppets and circus skills. He founded and directed the community arts company, Charivari, including Whitby Folk Week legends the Fabulous Salami Brothers, which he



fronted as Count Salami. Now a storyteller with an MBE, Taffy has a repertoire of more than 300 stories and Whitby wouldn't be the same without him!



NICK DOW

One of the best Folk voices of his generation. Nick Dow has been singing and collecting Traditional Folk Songs for over 40 years. His Guitar playing is sensitive and well thought out and his repertoire contains many songs you will hear nowhere else. Nick has gleaned songs from the West

Country and been given songs by the Travelling people with whom he has lived and worked. Also trained in the dying art of Gypsy Wagon Painting, working for a long list of Celebrities including Ronnie Wood. His gigs are informative, entertaining and nobody goes home disappointed.

JOHN CONOLLY

An internationally-respected songwriter, firmly rooted in British folk tradition. His most popular song, "Fiddlers' Green" (a fisherman's vision of Paradise) is performed and loved all over the world. Guaranteed a laugh at some of his funny songs but also a great deal of enjoyment to be had from his more serious side.

BRYONY GRIFFITH & ALICE JONES

Established solo artists on the folk scene, this powerful new duo is sure to turn some heads. From West Yorkshire, long-time purveyors and performers of traditional English folk music, united by a mutual fascination with local folk song and tune collections. Combining a respect for tradition with their own contemporary style of



performance, they present a unique repertoire of harmony, history and Northern banter, featuring fiddle, harmonium, tenor guitar and intricate vocals in their distinctive regional accents. We are also very lucky to have Bryony as our Yoof Club leader!



JOHN KIRKPATRICK

He joined The Hammersmith Morris Men as a 12-year-old in 1959 and has been dancing, singing and playing his way round every aspect of the English Folk Scene ever since. Working in all kinds of bands and duos, squeezing his boxes, singing his socks off, creating songs, tunes and The Shropshire Bedlams. Awarded lifetime membership of The International Concertina Association in 2002, the EFDSS Gold Badge in 2003 and now Her Majesty The Queen – always a fan – appointed him an MBE, for his contribution to English Folk Music.

VICKY COOPER

Band leader for Silkstone Greens North West Morris and a relative newcomer to all things folk but long-time musician. She has previously taught at North East Playgroup, Derbyshire Playgroup and Melodeons at Wensleydale. She has a passion for encouraging others to take up melodeon in the hope they love it as much as she does! She plays D/G and G/C melodeons, with a particular soft spot for French tunes. Her workshop is sponsored this year by Acorn Instruments.

PETE SHEPHEARD



A fine singer and melodeon player with a repertoire including many songs from his own collecting. He first came to the riches of traditional song as a life-long involvement in traditional song and music.

HAMMERSMITH MORRIS

Kitted out in blue and gold, cutting a dash on the streets and off, Hammersmith Morris Men continue to thrill and entertain audiences around the country. Known for their lively and engaging style they entertain at all manner of events and venues.

JIM MAGEEAN & GRAEME KNIGHTS

Jim has been running the Shanty Sessions at Whitby Folk Week for nearly 50 years, their home now in The Endeavour on Church St. Ably assisted by Graeme Knights, the sessions run on a 'come All ye' basis where everyone gets a sing (maritime



of course). The aim, to raise as much as possible for Whitby Lifeboat over the week by donations, raffles etc. Over £30,000 was raised in the last few years and we hope the good work will continue. 'Outward Bounders' at the beginning and 'Homeward Bounders' at the end of the week there are daily themes and surprise guests. Come and join Jim and Graeme for a pint and a shanty or two and help raise money too.



SIMON BROCK

One of only a handful of clog makers left in Britain. Having trained as a furniture maker and working with leather for 10 years, he was persuaded to take clog making seriously by his mentor Trefor Owen and has been making clogs full-time for nearly 4 years. Simon makes clogs for step dancing, morris dancing and increasingly, for people who just want a cool and unique pair of shoes. He can usually be found on his stall at Whitby Folk Week but this year he's doing a live demo from his Sheffield workshop instead.

PAUL BELLAMY & LYNN HAYNES

This brother and sister duo are resident singers at Grimsby Folk Club where they

started in the 60s as teenagers. In the 70s and '80s they were part of Galley and Force Four. Paul played fiddle with the Broadside Ceilidh Band and now The Little Band and the Bell Apple Boys. Paul and Lynn perform a mixture of traditional and contemporary songs sung in harmony and accompany themselves on guitar, fiddle and whistle.


JOHNNY HANDLE

Johnny's compositions ranging from poignant mining songs to the hilarious Geordie favourite Stottin' Doon the Waall sit comfortably alongside those of Joe Wilson, Tommy Armstrong and Geordie Ridley guaranteeing his place in North East folklore for generations to come.



MARTYN WYNDHAM-READ

In his late teens, he headed off, with his guitar, to south Adstrana where he worked on a sheep and cattle station, Emu Springs. It was while he was there, that he first heard the old songs sung by some of the station hands, became captivated by the character and atmosphere of the songs and the need to know more. He headed off to Melbourne, becoming part of the folk song revival throughout Australia during the early 1960s. Back to England in 1967, he met with renowned singer and song collector Bert Lloyd who had also spent time in Australia, made some albums with him, started recording for Bill Leader and later with Fellside Recordings.



Crows were popular on folk scene from 1978 to 1988. Following the sad death of Ralph Jordan in 2013, there is a new line up for the band's revival



featuring original members, Mick Ryan and Dave Bordewey. They are joined by Pete Harris (vocals, guitar, bouzouki) and the inimitable Paul Downes (guitar, banjo, mandocello, harmonies). All four highly respected performers in their own right. For the new 'Crows', it is very clearly 'Time To Rise' which is the name of their 2016 album.

MAGGIE MOORE & STAN BLOOR



A Suffolk-based folk duo, AKA Pluck & Squeeze (confusingly also the name of their ceilidh band!) Their love and enjoyment of music really bursts through. They always try to involve their audiences; be it at general concerts of traditional English song and music; themed concerts such as the Industrial Revolution in Lancashire; Music Hall or even Bawdy Ballads with songs from the 17th century to date - you can be

assured of a fun, varied show with lots of opportunity to join in. Maggie on melodeon, accordion piano and hammered dulcimer, Stan on Guitar, Banjo and Ukulele.

CHINEWRDE

Performing with attitude and precision from historic Warwickshire - indeed Kenilworth was called Chinewrde in the 11th Century. They're not quite that old but have been performing for over 35 years. In 1982 their vision was to



perform North West morris with trademark vigour and crispness. That is still their chief aim, along with preserving and developing the tradition - and having a lot of fun along the way! Driven on by a high-class band and high flying clogs.



WINDSOR MORRIS

Founded in 1974, when it was rare for women to dance morris. They established a reputation for innovative and vigorous performance of dances based on the Cotswold village traditions of Badby and Brackley and have always aimed to entertain

and impress the audience. Recently, they have created their own 'tradition' of more flowing dances, so that the variety of style and the different shapes and orientations of the dances give performances of interest and excitement.

JIM & LYNETTE ELDON

For thirty years or more, Jim played for a living on board the Bridlington pleasure boats Yorkshire Belle and Flamborian. That was a seven-days-a-week commitment from April to October, playing without amplification out on deck up to seven trips a day. Jim's wife, Lynette is a champion clog dancer and founder member of Green Ginger Clog Dancers. Together they have performed all over Europe and two of their albums showcase Lynette's expert step dancing.





LANCASHIRE WALLOPERS

This clog step team was born out of the teaching of the legendary Sam Sherry, who spent most of his working life as a step & acrobatic dancer in the music halls & variety. The Wallopers perform, in various imaginative routines, the steps of Sam Sherry and other famous Lancashire clog

dancers. Sam danced to entertain; the Wallopers aim to do the same.

SARA GREY

Once you have heard her you'll never forget her. She has a certain voice quality that compels you to give her your undivided attention, both powerful and sweet with a distinctive and lovely tremolo. It is a voice well suited to ballads and song that have travelled across the Atlantic to North America. Her singing also reflects her great knowledge of traditional singing. She just seems to know what is right in the interpretation of a traditional song. The breadth of her repertoire of songs is enormous.





BARBARA DYMOCK & CHRISTOPHER MARRA

A pair with many and varied musical collaborations behind them. "a musically enjoyable, mischievously entertaining performance from a well-matched duo" - The Herald. Barbara from Fife, learning Scottish and Irish songs from her grandparents. At Dundee Uni, amazed by the interest in her granny's "auld sangs", she began singing with the newly-formed Ceolbeg. Pleasing

crowds with her songs ever since and nominated as Scots Singer of the Year in 2011 at the Scots Trad Music Awards. Chris, a musician since his teens, working in genres from bighair rock to sophisticated pop and theatreland. Recording and performing with and producing for his brother Michael Marra.

LYNNE HERAUD & PAT TURNER

Individually and in combination with a variety of well-known singers and bands, Lynne Heraud and Pat Turner have both served long apprenticeships on the shop-floor of folk music. Fine voices with a plethora of songs, serious and comic.



ROISIN BAN

A predominantly traditional Irish band based in Yorkshire, playing a variety of tunes and songs from Ireland, Scotland, Brittany & England.



Maria takes traditional tales and makes them her own, breathing life into characters and taking the listener on journeys of magic and myth. She has a warm and engaging, humorous style which is well suited to sharing story secrets with her audiences.

Ben & Sel are regulars at Whitby Folk Week and folk festivals across the land as both musicians and dancers. They are familiar faces in the festival sessions. Ben

plays fiddle with the band Jigfoot among others and dances with Berkshire Bedlam Morris. Sel has danced and played with numerous morris teams and is an enthusiastic addition to a music session, playing the recorder, clarinet and Northumbrian pipes.

Award winning professional musician, singer and dancer, specialising in the musical traditions of Lincolnshire and Yorkshire. Drawing on a rich and diverse repertoire of traditional dance tunes and folk songs, charting the lives of everyday people, in their work and recreation, from the 1700s to the present day. Delighting audiences across the UK with performances at festivals and folk clubs from Whitby to Sidmouth, Morpeth to Nottingham, not to be missed.

Songwriter Janie's lyrics buoyed by Rob's musical arrangements recount heroic struggles of the recent past or show sensitive insight into contemporary issues. However, just as often, their songs spring from Rob's



repertoire, collected over a lifetime as a touring musician. Either way, Meneely and van Sante present a program laced with humour and galvanizing, sing-along energy.

PETE MORTON

He began his musical journey after coming across a Buffy St Marie record. From then, he decided to become a folk singer. Discovering songs of the 60s' protest movement, inspired him to write and take his songs to folk clubs and beyond which he's done for over 30 years. His latest album 'A Golden Thread' received rave reviews with eight self-penned songs. Often referred to as an old time troubadour, he has a compelling stage presence and approachable style delivering an unruly mix of humanism, politics, love, social commentary and humour, all wrapped around the folk tradition.

The formidable five Wilson Brothers, Tom, Chris, Steve, Ken & Mike are the accepted benchmark for powerhouse, unaccompanied singing. Tom, Chris and Steve celebrated 40 continuous years of

singing together during 2015, Ken and Mike joining them in the late 1970s. Sting has recently said of them: "They have a family sound and a natural, bone-deep understanding of music and harmony. And it's quite something."

Years of experience on the Playford, Contra and Ceilidh scenes stood them in good stead for transition to virtually playing for Zoom dances in 2021. Jonny plays a range of instruments including cowhorn, harpsichord, carnyx and näverlur - none of which will be played at our ceilidh. He will, however, play accordion. Vicki plays nyckelharpa - the magical keyed fiddle from Sweden. As far as she is concerned, no other instruments matter.

Playing Dales tunes, French music with Les Panards Dansants, Morris for Crook Morris and an eclectic mix of folk-dance with The Loose Knit Band. Leader of workshops and sessions, Bob wrote a book on the folk-dance music of the Yorkshire Dales and has a tutorial and tunebook for the three-row melodeon on the horizon.

A young melodeon player hailing from Derbyshire. Having been part of the first EFDSS National Youth Folk Ensemble and first cohort of the LCoM Folk degree, Benammi is an innovative player that specialises in English music but often branches out to Irish, Continental and even other genres of music.
